HAIL WESTON COMMUNITY DIRECTORY



THE 'ROYAL OAK' a thatched 18th Century pub, sits at the heart of our village. Having served as the social centre of Hail Weston for many generations the Royal Oak was sold by Charles Wells in November 2011, and closed as a pub on January 1st 2012.

Following a long campaign by the Hail Weston Community Pub Society to save The Royal Oak from redevelopment, the pub was bought by a group of eight local villagers in January 2017. With the help of over 100 community volunteers the building has been refurbished and reopened as an independent village pub on May 19th 2017.

The Royal Oak now offers lunches, evening meals, teas, coffees and cakes plus catering for private events. The beautifully restored interior offers a main bar, corner room, snug and garden room, plus a beautiful beer garden with plenty of seating and a sandpit where children can play. Dogs are welcome both in the main bar and on a lead in the garden.

St NICOLAS' CHURCH has been a focal point in the village of Hail Weston for over 800 years and continues today warmly welcoming both worshippers and visitors alike. A couple of years ago the church's Mission Action Plan listed 4 objectives, briefly these are:-

- 1. Hospitality: To encourage and engage with other churches in the Benefice (The Staughtons with Hail Weston) and local community groups;
- <u>2. Church Open</u>: To date we manage to open the church all day on Sundays and Wednesdays;
- 3. Raise Awareness: We hold special services such as Plough Sunday, Harvest, Pre-school Easter and Christmas services, and Christingle;
- 4. Re-Ordering: Hoping to make the church building more user-friendly a re-ordering committee has been established, an architect engaged and a survey recently carried out at the Village Fete where initial plans were available.

All the above is a 'work in progress' and is only possible thanks to the dedication of the Parochial Church Council continually working to keep the church alive and relevant in this 21st century. Continuing the hospitality theme it is with great excitement and enthusiasm that we introduce our new Rector, Revd Nicki Bland, who is very much looking forward to meeting everyone in the course of time.

The future of the church in Hail Weston is indeed looking good.



THE VILLAGE HALL is a centre for group activities in Hail Weston from daily pre-school classes and neighbourhood cafes to gardening and bridge groups. It is also a popular venue for birthday parties, village social events and fund raising activities including race nights and quizzes. The hall has a well equipped kitchen with fridge, cooker, microwave, tea crockery, teapots and urn as well as a hatch through to the main room. There are tables and chairs available to hirers of the hall and the venue has accessible toilets and wheelchair access.

Hire costs are £10/hour (£8 to village residents) with a minimum 2 hour hire for Sunday-Thursday evenings and weekend mornings and afternoons. There is a minimum 5 hour hire for Friday and Saturday evenings.

A PRE-SCHOOL ACTIVITY GROUP is based in Hail

Weston Village Hall and runs in term time from 9.15am-12.15pm with a lunch club until 1.15pm and an activity hour until 2.15pm. It accepts children from 2-4 years old and one of the key features of the pre-school is its relatively small size with a maximum of 26 children for each session. This creates a friendly and intimate family atmosphere enabling children to settle in well, quickly getting to know the staff and other pre-schoolers. The pre-school is managed and supported by a voluntary committee elected annually from the parents of attending children. This ensures those closest to the pre-school experience are those setting the priorities. On a day-to-day basis the pre-school is run by our incredibly dedicated and experienced pre-school leaders and staff.

We have a very high ratio of staff to children (our aim is 1 adult to 5 children) which makes it possible to offer a great deal of individual care and attention. In particular, each child has the support of a personal key worker who acts as the main link between yourselves and the pre-school as well as tailoring the curriculum to your individual child's needs.

We are self-financing and are registered for the Nursery Education Funding Scheme (NEFS) for 3-4 year olds.

OUR VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR

There is a defibrillator located on the outside wall of the village hall. This potentially life-saving device is available to any member of the public 24 hours of the day.

If somebody appears to be in need of resuscitation, any member of the public can call 999 and will be given all the information and guidance necessary to fetch the machine and apply it.

These machines have been instrumental in saving many lives in St Neots and the surrounding villages over the past year, and we are delighted that the **Hail Weston Community** was able to acquire one.

Following the successful fundraising effort by the village for the defibrillator, the **Crime and Safety Group** has agreed to raise a similar sum of money to purchase another defibrillator which, it is hoped, will be located near the West side of the village, outside the telephone box/mini library.

At the last defibrillator demonstration in the village hall it became clear that in the event of the need arising for one of these incredible life-saving devices at the other end of the village, by the time the defibrillator from the village hall was taken to the scene the carrier himself or herself would likely be in need of the device themselves!

Following fund raising efforts throughout 2017 we anticipate being in a position to order the second defibrillator early 2018.



'THE MONDAYS' SINGING GROUP

Anyone from Hail Weston and beyond who'd like to have a go at singing is welcome to join 'The Mondays' who meet (you guessed it) on Mondays. It's a fun, friendly group and joining is a great way to get to know other people from the village. We sing a variety of songs – mostly in 2 parts, sometimes more – from medieval carols to show tunes, pop songs to short classical pieces. With no auditions and no requirement to read music, enthusiasm is the only thing you'll need. To be honest we're currently an all-female group but a few brave men have joined us from time to time and are just as welcome! You might see us out and about leading the carol-singing and charity collection before Christmas or at occasional concerts, usually in the church, in aid of one or other Hail Weston fund-raising efforts.

Why not come along from 7.30pm – 9pm on Monday evenings. We meet in St Nicholas' church (although many of us are not members of the church) and we'd love to see you there! No practice on bank holidays - check the parish newsletter for any other no-meeting dates.

NEIGHBOURHOOD CAFÉ

The café opens in the village hall approximately twice a month, alternating between Wednesday and Sunday afternoons but always from 3.30 – 5.30pm. Dates are advertised in the monthly Hail Weston newsletter, Hail Weston 'MailChimp' email newsletter and (when we remember) on the website. You can also ask to be put onto an email list to receive reminders before each café date.

Warm drinks, juice for children, and cakes (many home made) are available. We accept donations to cover our incidental costs (cups/tea etc), towards Hail Weston projects currently raising funds and sometimes in aid of external charities or causes (as advertised). The café sometimes hosts a 'special interest table' (e.g. past tables have been set up to share information on beekeeping, Women's Institute, Alzheimer Society, Motor Neurone Disease Association and the history of Hail Weston).

The purpose of the neighbourhood café is simple - to provide an opportunity for Hail Westoners to meet old friends, make new friends, relax, share a chat and enjoy some cake.

Please do come along, whether you're popping in on your own or coming with a group of friends. We love to see new faces and everyone is very welcome, including family, friends and neighbours from outside Hail Weston. HAIL WESTON PARISH COUNCIL is the lowest tier of local authority. What the PC may, or may not, do is strictly controlled by Powers and Duties and a small group of elected or coopted residents who represent all parishioners and have responsibility for certain public open spaces including the playing field, the garden of rest, the new cemetery and the allotments. The Council represents Hail Weston on matters of planning and in procuring resources. In addition, Councillors are allocated specific areas of responsibility to cover areas where we'd like to make a positive difference to life in Hail Weston.

Up to 7 Councillors are supported by a part-time Parish Clerk who is also a first point of contact for residents wishing to get in touch with the Parish Council. Meetings are held monthly (usually no meeting in December) on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 7.30pm in the village hall. Residents or other interested members of the public are always welcome to attend meetings, and are invited to express views and ask questions during the earlier part of the meeting within the open forum item. The agenda is advertised at least 3 days in advance of each meeting on the Hail Weston Website and on the parish notice board by the old post office. Where an item is raised for discussion and decisions need to be made, the discussion is always advertised in advance to give residents a chance to put forward their views, either to the Clerk or Councillors or in public at the meeting. Councillors will take all views expressed into account when taking any decisions. Minutes from Parish Council meetings are also made available on the Hail Weston website, usually in draft the week following the meeting before approval at the following meeting.
