
## Neighbourhood Café

#### A message from the Rev'd Nicki Bland

#### Dear Friends,

Christmas is fast approaching and, in the days, and weeks before, there are plenty of opportunities to sing carols and Christmas songs.

There is a Benefice Advent Carol Service on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> December at All Saints, Little Staughton at 10.30 am and then on 17th December there is a Benefice Carol service at St.Andrew's ,Great Staughton at 6.00 pm and then in all three churches there are All Age services on Christmas Eve afternoon. Midnight Mass and Christmas Day All Age Benefice Service are in Great Staughton, but everyone is invited. In addition, in Hail Weston, there is Carol singing around the village and a carol concert by the Mondays.

I think that Christmas carols are part of our lives, we hear them played in shops, we expect to hear the Salvation Army in the streets and hear carols at Children's nativity plays.

It is thought that there were carols as early as Saxon times, but the first carol to be recorded was written in the 13<sup>th</sup> century by an Italian, Friar Jacopone, called 'Il Presepio,' 'The Crib' and just as a piece of added information, Jacopone died on one Christmas Day.

By 14<sup>th</sup> century Franciscan Friars were writing happy little carols to accompany their Nativity plays. They were catchy and easy to dance to. The word 'carol' comes from an old French word meaning 'ring dance'. They were loved by the people because they could understand them as they were written in French not Latin, but the Pope in Rome disapproved. Because of this many of all the hundreds of carols written in the next 400 years were lost but some reached England in the 14<sup>th</sup> century and they were written in English. 'Deck the halls with boughs of holly' is an old Welch carol from the 16<sup>th</sup> century and 'Away in a Manger' which is still a firm favourite with children and adults alike, was thought to have been written by Martin Luther for his own child.

There was the English Collection of carols published in 1521, but it was the Victorian hymn writers who made carols part of Christmas in Church. There are so many carols that have a story behind them like Good King Wenceslas and Silent Night, but it is often the tunes that we love as we sing them over and over again anywhere and everywhere, in the bath, in the car and as we are preparing our meals that resonate with us.

I pray that as you sing these well-known tunes you will remember the baby Jesus who is the reason behind all these carols, and also the reason we celebrate Christmas. I also hope that I will see you at one or more of the services over Christmas so that we can join in the celebrations and the singing of carols together. I wish you all a blessed, safe, and joyful Christmas.

# St Nicolas Church Restoration Group Update

I am delighted to tell you that, apart from some snagging, Phases 1 and 2 of St Nicolas Church Restoration are finally drawing to a close. Thank you to everyone for their patience during all the building work and, particularly, the immediate neighbours who have to contend with dirt, noise and parking problems at times. Thank you also for your tolerance whilst the churchyard was closed as it was designated a building site, with significant insurance implications should anyone have an accident there.

Whilst the contractors have done their best to make as little mess as possible, in reality, all building work inevitably creates dirt and dust and so the unsung heroes and heroines of this whole build have been the cleaning team, led by Elaine McCarthy who, once the contractor gave us permission to use the church at weekends, have gone in week after week, made everywhere look spick and span, knowing full well that they would face the same mess again next week. I cannot thank them enough.

I would also like to say a huge "Thank You" to the Garden Angels who have already put in countless hours, tidying up the churchyard as the contractors prepare to leave. The improvement is dramatic, and I am assured that there is much more work planned for the future.

Many people have contributed to bring this part of the project together and there are too many to name individually, but I want to reassure you that we do know who you are, and are extremely grateful to you. Thank you to Hail Weston PCC and the Parish Council for responding quickly to requests and, finally, I would like to thank everyone, past and present, who has been part of the Restoration Group itself. They have all worked tirelessly and it has been a real team effort. A heartfelt thank you to you all.

**Sunday 3rd December at 3 p.m.** There will be a Service of Celebration and Thanksgiving at St Nicolas Church for the new extension, followed by refreshments. We would love to see you there and be able to show you the wonderful new facilities that are now in place and will be available for use by the local community from now on.

#### **An Organ Christmas Appeal**

With quotes of £30,000+, a new pipe organ looked way out of our reach. However, we suddenly have the most fantastic opportunity to purchase a muchneeded, affordable new organ which is small enough fit into the new area in front of the roodscreen, can play the full range of church music and, best of all, can be played by anyone who can play a piano, whilst producing the magnificent sound of a full-blown pipe organ. We have already raised nearly half the cost of £3685 (including VAT and delivery) and are now launching a **Christmas Organ Appeal** to raise the rest.
