





What's been happening

East West Rail

As part of the Chancellor's Spring Budget 2023, the Government announced that they expected a route update in May 2023.

The Bedford to Cambridge proposal by East West Rail (EWR), will see new train services connecting Oxford, Milton Keynes and Cambridge - unlocking the area's potential to create jobs, grow the economy and attract investment for the entire country. Connecting Cambridgeshire

Ting Bus Roadshow

CCC Ward Cllr. Ian Gardener organised for Vectore, the new operator of the Ting Bus Service, to visit Hail Weston recently.

If you missed it as a reminder. This innovative bus service currently serves western Huntingdonshire. The Ting bus will collect you from any address within the service area. A bus stop is not required.



Journeys must be pre-booked, but this can be done on the day of travel. Bookings are made by calling 0115 777 3187 or by downloading the Vectare DRT app.

Buses operate every Monday-Saturday except bank holiday Mondays. First pick-ups are available from 06:00 each day with last drop-offs by 20:00.

The fare is £2 each way (£1 for riders under age 19). Concessionary passes are accepted on the service between 09:30 and 23:00 Monday-Friday and at all times on Saturdays. If you plan to travel with a wheelchair, pushchair, suitcases or a shopping trolley, then book via telephone so that a larger Ting vehicle is assigned to you.

There are a limited number of buses operating, so book one week in advance to avoid disappointment. If more riders use the service, we can make a better case to expand the service.

Photo ID required at Polling Stations

Residents are reminded that voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at Polling Stations. From October 2023 this will also apply to UK General Elections.

The accepted forms of photo ID are available at electoral commission.org.uk

You will still be able to use your accepted form of photo ID even if it's out of date, as long as it looks like you. The name on your ID should be the same name you use to register to vote.

National Highways Update: A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet Road Improvement Scheme

As you may already know "the court of appeal refused TAN's application to appeal the refusal of permission for a judicial review. This means that the legal process is now over, and we can start working towards construction.

"Unfortunately, the legal challenge has disrupted our construction timetable and the start of work has been delayed. We are keen to get started as soon as possible, so you will see us continue preparatory works including archaeology, environmental surveys and diverting utilities as we get ready for full construction.

"We plan to move into full construction by the end of the year and expect the road to open in 2027."

Parish Council vacancy

As you may know Jill Gooch, Parish Chair has decided to step down from the Hail Weston Parish Council. Jill has been active during her eight years and her knowledge and great service to the village will be missed.

A vote for the co-option will take place at the next Parish Council meeting. Co-option of this vacancy will feature thereafter on Parish Meeting Agendas until filled.

As a Councillor representing your community, you will help to keep it a great place to live. You will be supported in your role and will be expected to undertake training. You should be comfortable working electronically. You should have a positive outlook, a can-do attitude, and be willing to work as part of a team.

To qualify a person must, on the day of co-option, be a British citizen and attained the age of 18 years AND

- On that day and thereafter continue to be a local government elector for the area of the authority, OR
- Has during the whole 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or any other premises in the area; OR
- Has their principal or only place of work during that 12 months in the area; OR
- Has during the 12 months resided in that area; OR
- During the whole 12 months has resided within the parish or within three miles of it.

Planning

Call for Sites Consultation

Huntingdonshire District Council launched a 'Call for Sites' Consultation, as part of the second phase of engagement on a full update to the Local Plan.

The suitability of these sites will be assessed for potential allocation for their proposed use in the Local Plan update and consulted on in the future. Submitted sites will be assessed against the criteria set out in the Land Availability Assessment Methodology and the Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report.

The Local Plan is an important District Council document that sets the statutory planning framework for the district, shaping development many years into the future. Town and Country Planning Regulations state that the local planning authority must review it every five years starting from the date of adoption. Planning in progress

Solar Farm application: **22/01813/FUL** Installation of the solar farm (generating up to 50MW) Land East and West of Little Staughton, Solar Farm, Kimbolton Road, Hail Weston Huntingdon District Council status is **in progress**.

The **Natural Burial Ground** near to Sacred Stones site has concluded all relevant surveys and continues to monitor six dipwells as requested by the Environment Agency.

H D Planning recently attended a parish meeting to present the Outline Permission plans and drawings relating to Bird Lane development of three properties. Residents and the parish council were able to ask questions directly to the developers, which was helpful. The next stage is that the submission to HDC of a Reserved Matters planning application would be imminent. This application would address appearance and landscaping as the outline had already addressed heights, layout, and highways.

Other updates

Playing Fields

Hail Weston Parish Council are waiting for installation of a new gate and cycle racks which are due to be installed in early July. The PC are looking at ways to improve the playing fields and is in the process of receiving quotations for maintaining the mound, BMX Track and wooden fort.





The new climbing wall is being enjoyed and was funded by National Lottery funding.

The bench in the playing field was generously donated from funds raised at last years' Fete and Dog Show.

Solar Lighting B645

The Parish Council have recently bid again for some monies towards improving the cycle path connecting Hail Weston to St Neots. The Parish Council were part of 'complex applications' and against St Neots Town Council for seeking funding from Cambridgeshire County Council (CCC).

Drains

Cambridgeshire County Council have responded to the Parish Council's request to investigate issues with drains, with cameras as several have been unable to have been cleared routinely. Much thanks to Paul and Tony Bakers' efforts to get to the root of the issues, identifying problematic drains and reporting accurately has expedited up this issue, Thank you to both.

Hedges

Several residents have recently contacted the Parish Council to highlight issues they are having whilst walking and driving about the village. Most hedges reported look tidy but are starting to encroach footpaths and visibility so please do check yours. Thanks in advance.

Residents have also reported that due to the open nature of gardens in Orchard Close, dog fouling is a concern. Please be respectful that just because a front garden appears open it is not appropriate to let your dog foul there.
