

St Nicolas' Church - Remembrance Poppy Display 2023

Last year Mary Deacon was delighted that so many villagers contributed towards the lovely poppy display in the church and would like to add to the display this year. If you would like to help again, or have a go for the first time, the poppy pattern is below. Please contact Mary if you need to make arrangements for your poppies to be collected.

Crochet Poppy

Abbreviations:

ch chain dc double crochet st stitch tr treble crochet

ss slip stitch dtr double treble crochet

4.5mm (size 7) crochet hook

Red and black DK yarn

Using red yarn for poppy body

- 1. 4ch, ss to make ring
- 2. 1ch, 6dc into ring, close with ss
- 3. 2dc into each stitch, close with ss
- 4. 2 dc into each stitch, close with ss
- 5. 1 dc, 1tr, 1 dtr into 1st stitch
- 6. 2 dtr into next 4 sts
- 7. 1 dtr, 1 tr, 1 dc into next st
- 8. Repeat steps 5,6 and 7, 3 more times
- 9. Ss to close
- 10. 1dc into each stitch, ss to close round
- 11. Cut off varn and weave in end

Using black for poppy centre

Follow steps 1 and 2

Cut off yarn and attach to the centre of poppy body. Leave loose ends at the back so we can attach poppy to netting.

Knitted Poppy

- 1. Using size 8 (4mm) needles and red yarn cast on 120 sts
- 2. Rows 1-4 knit
- 3. Row 5, knit 3 tog to end (40 sts)
- 4. Rows 6-9 knit
- 5. Row 10, knit 2 tog to end (20 sts)
- 6. Rows 11-14 knit
- 7. Row 15, knit 2 tog to end (10 sts)
- 8. Cut yarn leaving long length and thread through remaining sts. Pull round into a circle and sew up side.
- 9. Using black yarn cast on 16 sts then cast off.
- 10. Roll into a tight spiral and attach to centre of poppy. Leave loose ends at back for us to attach poppies to netting.
