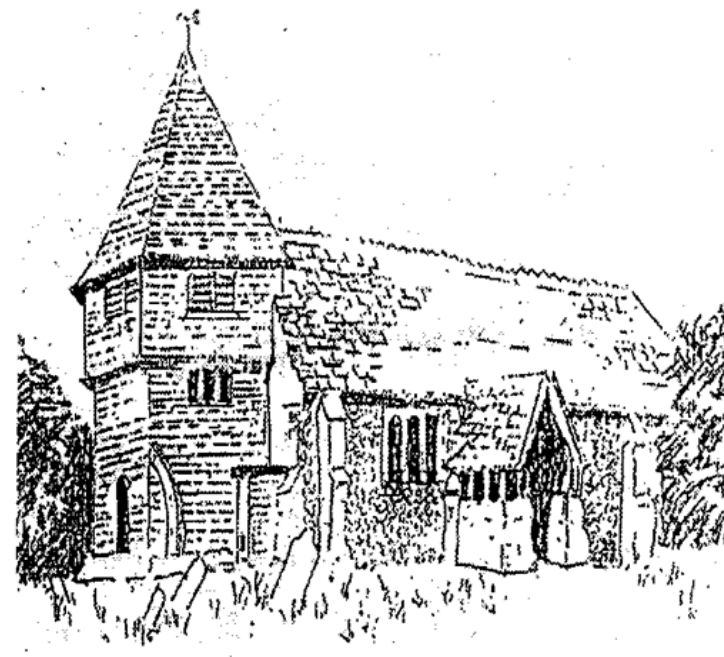
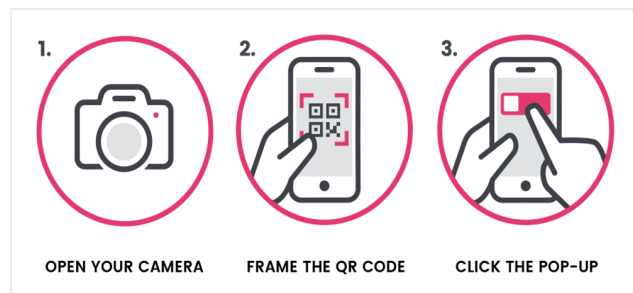

## A message from the Rev'd Nicki Bland

*Dear Friends,*

The Triduum maybe something that you have not heard of in the way Maundy Thursday and Good Friday are quite well understood The Triduum is the celebrating of the passion death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is celebrated in three services, Maundy Thursday with vigil, Good Friday an hour at the cross and an Easter Vigil which is held on this Holy night as the church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point, the Passover or the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life.

The first few verses of Easter 2020 by Malcolm Guite:

And where is Jesus, this strange Easter Day?  
Not lost in our locked churches, anymore  
Than he was sealed in that dark sepulchre  
The locks are loosed; the stone is rolled away,  
and he is up and risen, long before,  
Alive, at large and making his strong way  
Into the world he gave his life to save,  
No need to seek him in an empty grave.

We begin April with Holy Week which comes quite early this year. There is plenty to join in as we join in the journey towards Easter. The week and Easter itself are far more meaningful if you follow the whole of the week's events but do feel free to attend those you can.

We start Holy Week with a BCP communion at St Andrew's and then have Palm Sunday Services at Little Staughton and Great Staughton. Please come and collect your Palm Cross. The service at Little Staughton will be a communion Service and the service at Great Staughton will be an All Age worship service. Then we journey through the week with compline on Monday at St Nicolas, Hail Weston, at Great Staughton on Tuesday and Little Staughton on Wednesday, all at 7.00 pm .

On Thursday at Hail Weston, there will be a Maundy Thursday communion and vigil and the on Good Friday, weather permitting there will be a Good Friday walk at St Andrew's for all ages with Easter Egg hunt, hot cross buns, Easter story and other activities. This is usually very popular with the children rushing to find the eggs. Then in the afternoon we have a service of readings, music, quiet meditation at 2.00pm. One hour at the cross. This is my favourite service of the week and those who attend usually make it a regular event in their diary.

## St Nicolas Church Restoration Fund WE'VE DONE IT!

I am thrilled to tell you that we have now got all the funding that we need to begin Phase Two of the Restoration Project. We are in the process of completing funding contracts and further details of who our funders are, will be provided once everything is signed and sealed.

Phase 2 includes the removal, restoration and re-erection of the current south porch over the north door, the building of a small extension on the footprint of the former south porch, which will house a disabled toilet and small kitchen, and the reinstatement of the paths around the church. We are hoping to have everything in place so that we can make a start on the project before the bat breeding season which happens at the beginning of May.

We could not have reached this point without all your help, support and enthusiasm as this has weighed heavily with our funders when they were considering our grant applications. My heartfelt thanks to you all.

We are looking forward to seeing everyone at our Art Exhibition on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> April, which will include the auction of several water colour paintings of local scenes in and around Hail Weston, on the afternoon of Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> April. Hopefully this will be the beginning of fundraising for Phase 3, which is the renewal of heating and lighting in the church.
